On average, up to 80% of gun violence ⁷ goes unreported to 9-1-1. As a result, eight out of ten times when someone fires a gun, the police never show up, simply because they don't know about it. When gun crime and other crime isn't reported, perpetrators grow emboldened, putting everyone else in the community at risk.

Our mission is to reduce crime by partnering with community violence intervention (CVI) groups and other local organizations. By sharing precise data on when and where gun violence and other crimes occur, we help these groups respond quickly, so that they can provide critical support to youth and families in crisis and prevent future harm.

Data for Good – Assisting Community Violence Intervention and Public Health Groups

SoundThinking's Data for Good Program facilitates the ability for law enforcement to share gunfire data and other crime data with offices of violence prevention, schools, city and county public health departments and other community organizations. These tools indicate where gunfire and potential trauma may be occurring so the appropriate community resources can be deployed to offer immediate and lasting support and help address the core issues that drive crime.

Walking One Stop, Miami-Dade County, FL

SoundThinking partners with [Walking One Stop](#) ↗ to deliver gunfire data in Miami-Dade County, helping the organization target areas most affected by gun and gang violence. From 2018 to 2020, Walking One Stop provided nearly 3,000 service referrals—most within a week of initial contact.
